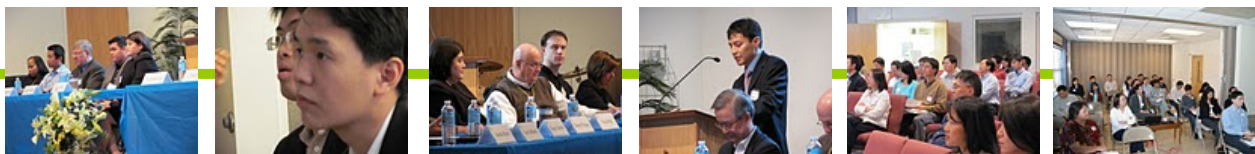
### Who We Are

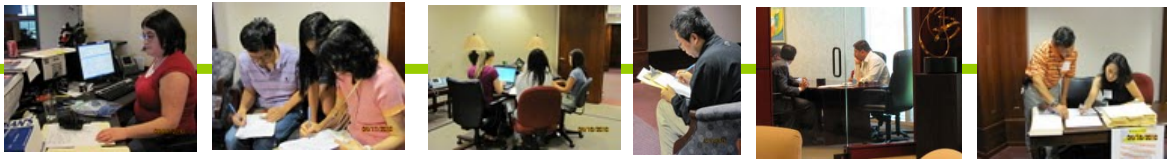
### What we do

In April, we helped host Immigration Day. In partnership with local and national law firms, the event sought to help immigrants navigate through the sometimes complicated immigration process. This pro bono service was just the latest in a string of projects, big and small, that Asian Focus is proud to be a part of.
